Update on Drew Street Crashes Will be Reduced by 57%



Last year the State Legislature required the Florida Department of Transportation to conduct additional analysis on the improved safety design for Drew Street. That study has been completed and it confirms significant safety improvements and minimal change in traffic flow or travel time. Here are the highlights of the study:

• The total number of crashes are expected to decrease by 57%.

• The build alternative will provide dedicated bike and safer pedestrian facilities.

 $\cdot$  Updated 2045 forecasts show that Drew Street will operate at the same level of service.

• Travel demand model volumes estimate that parallel routes will experience a 4% increase in traffic on average. This means that on the busiest parallel street (SR60) you would see two additional cars per minute. On average parallel streets would see on additional car every 1.5 minutes.

• The travel time from Downtown Clearwater (Osceola Ave.) to Keene Road (2.2 miles) is only expected to increase by 30 seconds.

**Remember** – This project will be paid for by \$12 million in FDOT and Federal Grant money. If this project does not move forward, the money will most likely go to a project in St. Pete, and Clearwater residents would have to fund any proposed safety improvements, of which there have been no alternative plans suggested. The average 100+ crashes per year on Drew Street would likely continue.

Six Clearwater Construction Projects Set to Break Ground in 2024



The City of Clearwater is about to enter a period of great change in our downtown. Four key projects are slated to break ground for construction during 2024. We will soon begin construction of our new low-cost and energy efficient **City Hall**. The city has contracted with an architect, a construction manager, and an owner's representative who will ensure the project is delivered on time and on budget.

The **DeNunzio** group has said they expect to break ground this fall on their **158 key hotel located on our Bluff**, that includes retail on the ground floor and a bier garden rooftop bar.

Right across the street, behind **Peace Memorial Church**, the city will soon begin construction on a **550 space parking garage** that will help serve the parking needs of Coachman Park, our downtown, and the Main Library.

**Fire Station 47**, located at 1460 Lakeview Rd. was built in the early 70's and is in need of replacement. A new Fire Station 47 will be constructed on property the City owns across from Clearwater High School on S. Hercules Ave. Biltmore Construction Company has proposed a new fully code compliant and energy efficient four apparatus bay, ten dorm room, four-bathroom fire station. Construction is expected to begin this spring and be complete in the summer of 2025.

Archway Partners should begin construction later this year on 81 units of much needed affordable and workforce housing at **1250** Cleveland St. The plan calls for 30 one-bedroom units and 51 twobedroom units. Communal amenities include co-working stations, a fitness center, a community garden, and a children's play area.

Finally, **Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority (PSTA)** will break ground at the corner of Myrtle and Court St. for their new **Multi-modal Transit Center** that will feature more bus bays, an enclosed rider terminal, ride share connections for services such as Uber and Lyft. Construction is expected to take 18-24 months. PSTA received a \$20 million grant from the US Dept. of Transportation for this project.



**Greenprint 2.0** is Clearwater's Sustainability Plan that identifies commonsense approaches and policies that our local government is uniquely positioned to implement – actions that can reduce energy use and waste (thereby saving taxpayer dollars), create local jobs, improve air quality, and benefit Clearwater for years to come. Our Sustainability Coordinator, Cassie Cordova, recently gave an update on the progress we've made and the money we've saved. Measurable goals are key, and Clearwater is determined to be a leader in sustainability in our region.

- 1<sup>st</sup> year:
  - $\downarrow$  9% electricity
  - $\downarrow$  27% natural gas
- 2<sup>nd</sup> year (partial):
  - ↓ 12% electricity
  - ↓ 39% natural gas
  - ↓ 6% water/irrigation
- Cost avoidance = \$1,153,460
- Cost savings = \$375,760

At our next election, on Tuesday, March 19, 2024 voters will elect three members to the City Council –mayor and seats 2 and 3. Voters will also vote on a referendum to change our elections from March to August, including a change from a plurality to a majority, which is expected to impact the cost of city elections and turnout. ### Liv-Up is Helping Pinellas Seniors "Age in Place" in Their Homes



Our senior population in Pinellas County is one of the fastest growing demographics that are facing homelessness. The Village Movement is a grassroots effort to help seniors "age in-place" in their homes. In Pinellas County, it's known as LIV-UP (pronounced "live" up), or Lutheran Intentional Village, Upper Pinellas.

LIV-UP is comprised mainly of volunteers from the following Clearwater Lutheran churches – St. Paul's on Gulf-to-Bay, First Lutheran on Nursery and Grace Lutheran on North Highland.

LIV-UP's service area for 2024 is between Ulmerton Road on the south and Tampa Road on the north. However, the group hopes to include additional churches so they can reach more 55+adults.

Specific services (Free!) include coordinating access to services such as transportation; home repairs; computer assistance; and social, educational and wellness activities.
